Tri-Agency Indigenous Research Strategy:

Strengthening Indigenous Research Capacity – Key Developments for 2023-2024

- The <u>Indigenous Leadership Circle in Research (ILCR)</u>, established in 2022, met in-person at Zibi Island on unceded Algonquin territory on October 26 and 27, 2023, to reflect on the progress made and future priorities.
- The agencies introduced amendments to the <u>Tri-Agency Guide to Financial Administration (TAGFA)</u> relating to compensation for Indigenous Elders, Indigenous Knowledge Keepers, or Indigenous people affiliated with not-for-profit organizations who are not already being compensated to conduct research.
- On January 31, 2024, the agencies released <u>What We Heard: A Report from the Three Federal</u> <u>Research Funding Agencies' Ad Hoc Working Group on Indigenous Citizenship and Membership</u>, as the basis for moving beyond self-identification within the context of programs, funding opportunities or appointments intended for Indigenous people.
 - New <u>Tri-agency Policy on Indigenous Citizenship and Membership Affirmation</u> and <u>associated directive</u> was announced this summer
- Together, the agencies have worked to develop a new mechanism to better support the indirect costs of research for Indigenous not-for-profit-organizations that administer funding. Implementation is underway at various stages throughout the three agencies.

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2024 Discovery Grants Results

2024 Discovery Research Program Competition Results

- Discovery Grants offered \$84.3M in new awards
 - o 3186 applications; 2015 awards, 63% overall success rate; average grant size \$42k
 - o The CY2024 cohort is the size of a typical pre-pandemic competition
- Research Tools and Instruments awarded over \$25M
 - $_{\odot}$ 666 applications; 199 awards, with a 30% success rate
- Subatomic Physics Grants invested over \$18.5M in new awards
 - o 52 applications across all categories; 38 awards
 - Success rates ranged from 36% to 88%
- **Discovery Horizons** offered \$5.5M in new awards
 - o 81 LOIs received, 33 full applications reviewed, and 15 grants awarded

nserc-crsng.gc.ca **RGS Program Updates** NSERC Leave Policies **Primary Caregivers** Researchers who become primary caregivers following the birth or adoption of a child and who are eligible for maternity or parental leave through the institution but decline the leave, may be eligible to receive a one-year grant extension with funds. **Family and Medical Leave** Grant holders who plan to take family-related leave or medical leave may be eligible for a grant extension with funds for up to two years. Paid Maternity / Parental Leave for Students and Postdoctoral Fellows paid from Grants Students and Postdoctoral fellows who are paid out of an NSERC grant, and those receiving awards directly from NSERC, are eligible to receive up to 12 months of paid maternity / parental leave. The leave supplement will be paid by NSERC.

Ship Time Program (STP)

- Ship Time grants assist with the high costs associated with chartering research vessels in Canada and abroad, in support of on-going Discovery research programs
- Typical duration of grant: one year (two years possible, with proper justification)
- Applicants must hold a Discovery Grant (or be successful in current DG competition)
- Three weighted selection criteria:
 - Scientific or Engineering Excellence (40%)
 - Need and Urgency for Ship Time (40%)
 - Contribution to the training of HQP (20%)
- New 2024: Q&A session was offered in August
- Deadline: September 1st

RGS Program Updates

Northern Research Supplements (NRS)

- **Objective:** To augment and promote Canadian university-based northern research, training, and community outreach by recognizing the added costs unique to conducting research in the Canadian North.
- Canada's North: The land- and ocean-based territory north of the southern limit of isolated patches of permafrost from northern British Columbia to Labrador, including the entirety of the three territories (not the stretch down the central Rocky Mountains along the BC/AB border)
- Application process:
 - ✓ Part of the Discovery Grant (DG) application process, with additional components required for NRS
 - ✓ Separate review committee they do not see the full DG application
- Up to \$25,000/year for duration of the DG award

Discovery Development Grants (DDG)

Description:

- No separate application is required offered according to DG results
- Provide resources to established researchers from small universities whose DG applications were deemed to be of appropriate quality to merit research support but were not funded in the DG Competition.
- NEW value: \$20K/year for 2 years

Objectives:

- · To promote a diversified base of high-quality research in small universities
- · To foster a stimulating environment for research training in small universities

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RGS Program Updates

PromoScience Program

 Provides financial support to organizations working with young Canadians in elementary school and high school (including the equivalent first year of college in Quebec), and their educators, to promote an understanding and interest in STEM through hands-on, interactive learning experiences.

Objectives:

- o Increase interest in STEM
- o Inspire young Canadians to study science and engineering, and to pursue careers in these fields
- o Promote diversity in STEM through initiatives targeting underrepresented groups
- Grants of up to \$200,000 per year for 3 years
- Eligible organizations:
 - o Canadian registered non-profit organizations
 - o Post-secondary institutions
 - o Non-federal museum or science centre

Program updates

CREATE program:

- o Letter of intent (LOI) stage is now non-competitive; LOIs will proceed directly to application stage
- The Industrial stream has been eliminated. Industrial participation in CREATE initiatives is encouraged, but the extent of industrial participation is determined by the applicants/partners
- Mobility experiences are now mandatory for all Masters and PhD trainees, with a minimum duration of one month for Masters and two months for PhD trainees

Black Scholars:

- o Announced in Budget 2022; \$40.9 million over five years and \$9.7 million ongoing
- o Eligibility is based on applicant self-identification data and consent
- o In 2023-24, nearly 300 students/fellows benefitted from this initiative
- Indigenous Scholars Awards and Supplements (ISAS) Pilot Initiative:
 - NSERC and SSHRC are continuing the ISAS pilot initiative
 New <u>Tri-agency Policy on Indigenous Citizenship and Membership Affirmation</u> and <u>associated directive</u> will apply
 - o 2023 competition: 24 individuals offered both an IS award and IS supplement; 14 individuals awarded an IS supplement
 - o Effective this year, NSERC recipients may be eligible for other supplemental funding

Timelines:

- The call for nominations will launch in August of 2024
- · Application deadlines
 - o November 28, 2024, for the Herzberg, Polanyi, Brockhouse and Strickland Prizes
 - o December 14, 2024, for the Synergy Prize and McDonald Fellowships

In nominating a person or a team, please consider:

- · Including various contributions to research such as transfer of knowledge, training and mentoring of highly qualified personnel, or communication of research to non-specialist audiences.
- Encouraging your colleagues to nominate someone as there can be more than one nomination per • institution.
- · Thinking broadly before nominating to ensure diverse candidacies are considered.
